Sunday, June 8, 2013 — WEEKEND RIDE: Ride the Lake

Ride around Lake Tahoe in a clockwise direction. Meet at the Pearl Izumi store (at the corner of Highways 50 and 89) and be ready to ride at 9:30am. After the ride Dave will host a BBQ at his house so you may opt to start from his house at 9:00am. The usual after ride sodas, chips, and cookies will be provided along with a variety of burgers and hot dogs. See the website for more details.

Sunday June 14, 2013 — WEEKEND RIDE: Sonora Pass

Ride starts at the Caltrans station at the intersection of CA108 (Sonora Pass) and US395 at about 9:00am. We'll go about 65 miles out and back to cover both sides of Sonora Pass turning around at the store in Dardanelle. This is a very steep out and back. Bring plenty of food and water as there is none until the store. See the <u>club website</u> under "Road Bike Routes" and "395 South" for for more route details. Our event features almost two hundred miles of roadway, 12 rest stops, 1 water stop, and a great menu for post ride meals at Turtle Rock Park. This year's "Build-Your-Own-Challenge" option is very popular with many participants choosing to ride their favorite combination of passes

New for 2014 are the Foothill Fun Ride options for riders who are looking for options that don't involve riding passes. These include the Carson Valley Ride (37 miles), the Diamond Valley Ride (19 miles), and the Carson River Canyon Ride (15 miles).

Regardless of the challenge each rider chooses for themselves, they'll collect stickers on their personalized souvenir rider bib to commemorate their achievement.

Please plan to come out to support the Wild Sierra on FridayJune 27, the day of June 28, and/or the morning of June 29. Volunteer AND Ride the Wild Sierra

As a club member volunteering for the event you have three options for riding:

1.Staff Ride.

If you volunteer all or most of the day on June 28 you can ride the staff ride for free on July 19. The staff ride has all the pass options, but fewer rest stops, and no support vehicles.

2. Ride Free.

If you volunteer for 8 hours or more for two years, you can ride in the event for free in the third year.

3. Volunteer & Ride.

If you volunteer for 8 hours or more, you can ride the same year for 50% off the regular ride fees. So, for example, you could ride in the morning and then volunteer in the afternoon and evening.



Construction season has begun! Be careful, Be Safe and Be Aware of changes ahead

Watch out for varying and changing road conditions around and through construction areas in our area. Bicycles and pedestrians should be accommodated through construction zones but those conditions can have a wide range.

- 1.Kingsbury Grade (SR 207) Reconstruction at night Sunday night 6pm to Friday morning at 6:30am. Hwy will be closed again for a period after Labor Day.
- 2.Mt Rose Hwy (SR 431)- reconstruction at night
- 3. Hwy 50 East Mound House area reconstruction at night
- 4. Hwy 395/Carson Street South in Carson City- reconstruction at night
- 5.Hwy 395/I-580 North of Carson City, North Carson Street interchange to East Lake Blvd. reconstruction of onramp by Hobart Road reconstruction at night with narrow lanes. Note that bicycles and pedestrians are allowed on this stretch of freeway as there is not a viable alternative route at this time.
- 6.**Hwy 395 south of Carson City** construction of I-580 freeway limits alternative routes. Hwy 395 northbound is main access but provides pinch points-no/limited shoulders in locations. The new Snyder Ave bridge should be open soon and will provide another and safer access route via Center and Roop Streets from the south into Carson City.

Thank You to all the participants and all the club members that came out helped make the Pine Nut Cracker 2014 a great mountain bike race for the 22nd year in a row.








Hung-A-Lel-Ti Bike Fix Clinic

Board Meeting Minutes - June 2, 2014

Secretary: Jim Sadilek; Other Board Members: Chris Rhiner, President; Frank Dixon, Treasurer; Michael Bayer, Alta Alpina Challenge Ride Director/Newsletter Publisher; Robert Braun, Membership Coordinator; Garth Jackson, Weekend Ride Coordinator; Tammy Lundquist, Road Cleanup Director; Tim Rowe, Bicycle Advocacy Coordinator; Wayne Treloggen, PR Coordinator; Other Attendees: Christopher Rowe

Meeting called to order at 6:20 pm Minutes of the May 4th meeting were approved as circulated

1. Monthly Status Reports:

- Treasurer: The current checking account balance is: \$21,825.16. The PayPal account balance is \$39,976.63.
- Membership: Individual Members, 191; Family Memberships, 72.
- Weekend Rides: We have weekend rides planned through July 20 except for June 21 and the July 4 weekend. Garth will come up with plans for those weekend and get the details posted in time for the June newsletter. We need to solicit ride leaders for the rest of the summer.
- Newsletter: June newsletter is planned to go out June 4 and we're in good shape for content.
- Website: New software has been obtained for both membership and Challenge registration records.
- Weekly Road Races: The races have been a success. The full season schedule is here: http:// www.altaalpina.org/clubracesroad/. The races on May 20 with Reno Wheelmen at Boca were snowed out.
- Mountain Bike Races: A plan for possible mountain bike race series for after the Challenge was discussed.
- Ray Rickard Spring Century: The ride (May 25) was well attended with more than sixty riders. The weather was cooperative—perhaps the warmest Spring Century ever. Several new members were signed up.
- Pinenut Cracker: The Pinenut Cracker (May 18)
 attracted 48 riders and was judged a successful event.
 Pizza and sodas were served after the races. Robert
 Braun, who coordinated the event, stated that he will
 not be available in the future. A new person to
 coordinate the event in the coming years is needed.
- King of Kingsbury Time Trial: Allen Biaggi proposed to hold the event in September after Kingsbury closes and there was consensus that he should proceed.
- Junior Team: No report.
- Cyclocross Race: Planning has not yet started.
- Bike Advocacy: NDOT's "Bicycles not advised" sign at the base of Kingsbury is in violation of NDOT rules which require all vehicles to be given the same rights, bicycles are vehicles. Highway construction projects with lane closures, in addition to Kingsbury, will be

- beginning in Carson City, Mt. Rose, and Mound House. The Snyder Street bridge in Carson City, which was scheduled to open in April, remains uncompleted. The bicycle route to the south on Ponderosa has been cut off, leaving Highway 395 the only way south for bicyclists coming from Carson City. This is a particularly dangerous route, for which NDOT apparently has no alternative.
- Adopt A Highway: Next clean up day scheduled for July 20. Meet at Turtle Rock Park. Tammy will provide yummy coffee and bagels.
- Clothing: Michael did an inventory of previous generation club clothing. Board agreed to promote the sale of these items at a discount.
- Challenge: Registrations are currently at 290 with at least 100 more expected by the ride date.
- Club Stickers: Motion 06/01: Replenish the club's supply of the circular AACC yellow stickers, 1.000 pieces at \$289.00. Chris Rhiner/Frank Dixon – Carried unanimously.
- Repair of Ice Chests: Motion 06/02: Approve a budget expenditure of \$40 to purchase repair parts for the club's ice chests. Chris Rhiner/Frank Dixon – Carried unanimously.
- 4. Radio Equipment: Paul Gulbro has supported the challenge for many years with a great deal of equipment and support. We've budgeted funds each year to offset his costs but Ham operators are barred by FCC rules from accepting anything of value for their effort. We've agreed that to support the Ham radio community we should acquire equipment in our name that can be used in all local events.Motion 06/03: Approve a budget expenditure of \$600 to purchase radio equipment and repair parts. Frank Dixon/Garth Jackson Carried unanimously.
- 5. Club Member Volunteer Ride Options: The board reviewed the options for club members wanting to ride the challenge. There are three options: (1) Volunteer all day on June 28 and ride the staff ride, (2) Volunteer 8+ hours each of two years and ride for free the third year, (3) Volunteer 8+ hours on year and ride for 50% fee the same year. This will be communicated in the newsletter. A volunteer appreciation BBQ will be hosted at Frank's house in South Lake Tahoe. Date and details TBA..
- Next Meeting: Monday, July 7, 2014, 6 pm, in the Lake basin. Venue to be announced.
 Meeting adjourned at 8:35 pm
