- (**) Two-up Time Trial: Teammates should be chosen before the race, if possible. No mixing categories. Each rider gets the points of the team. The second rider across the line records the team's time.
- (***) Intra-team Criterium: Format to be determined.

Pinenut Thursday Night Mountain Bike Race Series

Since we all like mountain biking so much, the club decided to try a weekly Cross Country Mountain Bike Race Series in the Pinenuts.

The race dates are:

5/18 5/25 6/1 6/8 6/15

Registration/Start/Finish will be at the world famous "Tree": From 395 at the south end of Gardnerville, turn on Pinenut Road. After about 2 miles, turn left onto Pinenut Road 2. Go about 1 mile, and on the right side, look for an open area with one pinenut tree ("The Tree"), and room for parking about 20 cars. You've gone too far if you get to where the road turns to dirt.

Registration will start at 5:30 pm and racing will begin at **6:15 pm**.

The course is top secret, but categories (and approximate distances) will be:

- A Expert 17 mile course
- B Sport 12 mile course
- C Beginners. 7 mile course

This is a non-licensed and non-sanctioned event. Trophies will be awarded to the top three finishers in each class.

Time to flex those legs on this AACC classic ride. There are lots of ups and downs and some steep pitches. The normal route goes about 60 miles, but there are opportunities for more or less depending upon your fitness and enthusiasm. Remember the spring mileage contest? The hills will be green and flowers will be in bloom. Perfect! Meet at Pickett's Junction at 09:00 to carpool or at the parking lot behind the post office in Volcano at 10:30. Bring a change of clothes and enough cash for on-road snacks and a post-ride meal.

Sunday, April 23, 2006

Smith Valley to Bridgeport and Return

We return to Smith Valley, but head south over Sweetwater Summit, down to the Walker River, then west to Bridgeport where we can get food and water. Return is by the same route to make this an 80-mile ride. There is some climbing, but the gradients are modest. The longer distance makes a good tune up for next weekend.

Sunday, April 30, 2006 — Chico Wildflower Century For most of us this is the first big one for the year. Go up to Chico on Saturday and see what it's like to ride around a bike friendly town. It's an opportunity to renew old cycling friendships and the Chico Velo CC puts on a terrific ride with great chow afterwards. Get the particulars at www.chicovelo.com. This is an AACC must do event. Fly the colors.

Saturday, May 6, 2006 — Wine Country Century

Another great California Spring century ride, and an AACC fave. The Santa Rosa Bicycle Club sends you on a tour through the vineyards and redwood groves of Sonoma County, including a visit to the coast if you opt for the 200 km route. The rest stops are well stocked, and there is a barbecue dinner afterwards. Riding and food? Yes! Details at: www.srcc.com/wcc.html

Saturday May 7, 2006 — Dueling Century Rides Two faces of California. The Grizzly Peak Century and the Delta Century. These two rides could hardly be more different. Grizzly Peak features lots of climbing in the Oakland-Berkeley hills and skirts major urban areas in the East Bay, while the Delta has maybe 100 ft. of climbing and winds through the back roads and small towns of the delta region and visits places that you didn't know were there. Both are good rides, but the Grizzly Peak definitely has the edge on food with piles of fresh baked cookies. You can gain weight on this ride. More riding and more food! Gardnerville 100

Big Daddy's Bicycles & Alta Alpina presents the Gardnerville 100. In the past, this ride was limited to the first 80 people to sign up. Due to increased demand, the ride has expanded to the first 160 people to register. Call 775-782-7077 during business hours to sign up.

The route will be the same as in rides past, Gardnerville to Topaz Lake via Hwy 395, Topaz to Markleeville via Monitor Pass, Markleeville to Gardnerville. It is about 72 miles. For the brave studs who ride the awesome 107 mile loop, the route continues from Markleeville to South Lake Tahoe via Woodfords Canyon, Luther Pass Hwy 88 to 89 to Pioneer Trail to Kingsbury Grade Hwy 207. Back to Big Daddy's via Mottsville lane to Hwy 88.

The ride is free to any Alta Alpina Cycling Club member. If you are not yet a member, just join the club before the event and ride for free. This is a semi-supported ride; you must carry money for the various convenient store stops. We will have support on the top of Monitor Pass and a barbecue on the patio of Big Daddy's after the ride, with cool, raffle prizes. The 72 milers will get one free raffle ticket and the 107 milers will get 3 free tickets.

The only way we can continue having so many activities is with volunteer help. In particular, the Death Ride is the event we use to fund our club and keep our

membership dues low. All club members are expected to volunteer. This year we'll be thanking our member volunteers with a snazzy new AACC Volunteer Baseball Cap, which you can pick up at the first event for which you volunteer. But we have an ulterior motive: PLEASE wear your cap when volunteering for the Death Ride and other club events, since there are many non-club members helping

out, too. Let's make it clear that Alta Alpina members put on some of the most popular bike events in the west.

Another great reason to volunteer is to take part in our Ride Reimbursement Program. Each year the club

asks you to put in volunteer hours and in return you can get reimbursed for organized rides and races in which you wear your club jersey. The requirement for 2006 is 12 hours of volunteer time and we encourage you to split some of those hours between the Death Ride and the club's other events. (See elsewhere in this newsletter for info about volunteering for the Death Ride, Carson Valley Classic or Pinenut Cracker.) The annual reimbursement cap is still \$600; however, the maximum reimbursement is governed by the club budget and calculated at the end of the year when all the reimbursement requests are tallied.

To be eligible for reimbursements, you must:

- · Volunteer 12 hours
- Wear an AACC jersey in each organized ride or race for which you want to be reimbursed
- Attend at least the Spring Party, Gardnerville 100, or the Fall Dinner/Meeting
- On or before 12/5/06, submit a single reimbursement form listing qualifying rides for 12/1/05 through 11/30/06 along with copies of receipts

See our website, www.AltaAlpina.org, for more details. Reimbursement program aside, volunteering is fun. You'll meet more club members and be rewarded with the pride that "we pulled it off again!" I look forward to working with you all again this year!

- 1. Monthly Status Reports:
 - Treasurer's Report: No report.
 - Death Ride: Active.com made errors in notifying people they had been accepted for the Death Ride. The errors have now been corrected. Tickets have been mailed or delivered to bike shops for people to pick up. A total of 73 volunteers have signed up, 38 are Alta Alpina members. Contingency plans and alternate routes were discussed.
 - Junior Team: Members of the junior team will be traveling to the Sea Otter Classic. John Seher will look into getting "property of Alta Alpina" stickers for club bikes and other equipment.
 - Newsletter: Libby requests race results be sent to her for publication.
 - **Membership**: 67 members have renewed their membership on the website.
 - **Clothing**: The spring clothing order is done and will be here soon.
 - Weekend Rides and Mileage Contest: There
 has been good turnout for weekend rides. Future
 rides will be announced by email and a schedule
 will be published in the newsletter. The mileage
 contest is in progress. Prizes will be awarded for
 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in Senior Women, Senior
 Men, Junior Women and Junior Men. The Board
 approved \$250.00 for prizes.
 - Wednesday Night Races: Christine presented the schedule.
 - Mountain Bike Race Series: The races will be free to everyone, not just club members. Michael will have the routes confirmed by the next meeting, assuming it's not still raining. He is still looking for a sweep person.

- Pinenut Cracker: Advance registration and day
 of registration will be the same price. The cost to
 club members will be \$15. Junior members can
 ride for free. The course will be the same as last
 year.
- CVC: Permits have been obtained and information put on websites. This year there will be volunteer captains to organize the volunteers.
