The Ray Rickard Spring Century takes place on Sunday May 27th—the Sunday of memorial day weekend. Once again, we have several ride options so there's an option for everyone. New for this year, we've opted for distances that encourage everyone to meet up at the end to enjoy the BBQ. Choose from the metric century option—the Main Ride, Monitor West Side, or a relaxed loop of Diamond Valley. See the full maps on pages 2.

There will be three well stocked rest stops:

- at the East side bottom of Monitor ("Topaz") from 9:30-noon,
- •the top of Monitor 11:00-2:00, and
- opposite Woodfords Inn 12:00-3:30.

Tina Keegan has graciously volunteered to host the event and the ride start/finish and the post ride BBQ at her home again this year. She is located between Foothill and Hwy. 88 off Centerville Rd. The address is 1008 Georgia Lane which is at the corner of Centerville and Georgia. Parking is limited so riding to the start and car pooling are encouraged. If you'll be driving, please park on the east (right) side of Georgia Lane or on Centerville Rd.

The main ride starts at 8:00am with our annual photo so please arrive early and be ready to to roll at 8:00am.

There is plenty of lawn at the finish, but if you would prefer a chair, you need to bring one. A big thanks to those who have volunteered to help at the rest stops and to Tina for hosting.

Please RSVP to springcentury@altaalpina.org as soon as possible so we have enough food for everyone. Please indicate which ride option you're planning to do (Main, West Side, or Diamond Valley) and your burger preference (Beef, Turkey, or Veggie).

The 68 mile West Side ride starts can be started any time after 9:00am. It's an out-and-back so if you're running late or need to cut your ride short you can turn around at any time.


The 30 mile Diamond Valley ride, with ride leader, will be at 11:30am.




We're still looking for volunteers to help with setup on Saturday and Clean-up after the event.




Diamond Valley Option (11:30am)

AACC Weekend Ride Schedule—April/May

We have a great schedule of weekend rides planned for 2018 and we're off to a great with some fun well attended rides. We're still looking for weekend ride leaders for a greater variety of ride options. Please send an email to ridecoordinator@altaalpina.org if you can lead a weekend ride.

Saturday April 28, 2018 — Genoa to Markleeville

Meet at Genoa Town Park on Nixon Street in Genoa (Nixon is just the continuation of Genoa Lane), ready to ride at 10am. We'll ride out along Foothill Road to Carson River Road to Woodfords to Markleeville, and return taking Diamond Valley, for about 2500 ft of climbing and 50 miles. It's an out-n-back, so if you're looking for a shorter ride you can turn around when you've had enough. This is a designated Weekend Ride, so snacks and drinks will be served afterward.

Saturday May 5, 2018 — Jacks Valley Out and Back

Meet at the base of Kingsbury, ready to ride at 10:00am. We'll head north through Genoa for an easy ride up to the Clear Creek trailhead.

Saturday May 12, 2018 — Kingsbury-Luther Loop

Meet at Genoa Town Park on Nixon Street ready to ride at 9:30am. We'll ride up Kingsbury to Lake Tahoe, to Pioneer Trail to old South Upper Truckee Road, and over Luther Pass, down Woodfords Canyon and back along Foothill to the start, for about 4800 feet of climbing and 62 miles. Or just join us for the Kingsbury portion if you want.

Saturday May 19, 2018 — Lemond Loop, Clockwise

We'll start from Schat's Bakery at 9:30am. and head for Spooner Pass. The route takes us from Spooner on Highway 28 around the lake to Incline Village. We'll take Village, College, SR 431, SR 341 to Virginia City and then down to Hwy 50 and back to the start via Empire, and California Trail. The Lemond Loop is 80 miles and over 8,700 feet of climbing. We'll make stops at Tunnel Creek, Veterans Pkwy Maverick, Virginia City, and possibly the Chocolate Factory. There is an option for reducing the ride by 8 miles and 1,900 feet of climbing by taking Alt 395, Lakeview, and the V&T trail for more modest early season goals.

Sunday May 27, 2018 — Ray Rickard Memorial Spring Century

One of our biggest club rides of the year—an event with multiple distance options, rest stops, and post-ride BBQ that's free for all members. For 2018 Tina Keegan has volunteered her property off Centerville Road for our start/ finish location. The three ride options for 2018 are: the full 70 mile loop over Monitor Pass, a 65 mile out-and-back to the top of Monitor, and the 36 mile Diamond Valley loop.

Sunday June 10, 2018 — Ride around Lake Tahoe & BBQ

Meet at Dave Scarborough's house, ready to ride, at 8:30am (see address posted on website rideboard). We'll ride clockwise around the lake at a medium casual pace—a distance of about 72 miles—with frequent regroups. We will have snacks and BBQ leftovers from the Spring Century afterwards. (Also feel free to bring your own meat to BBQ.) Please let us know if you are coming so we know how much food to defrost

For those who are a little nervous about getting started with racing we suggest participating in the **Time Trial Series**—the subset of the overall series consisting of just the time trials. Rain or Shine

Races will take place rain or shine, hot or cold, still or windy or smokey. We won't cancel a race. However, the Race Steward reserves the right to adjust the course, timing, or number of laps to reflect conditions. If access to a race start location is blocked for some reason we'll simply move the start to the closest possible location and adjust the course. If conditions change after the start of a race and the Race Steward determines that it must be terminated early for safety reasons all racers will receive 5 points for the series.

Race Registration

Register for each race between 5:30pm and 6:00pm. If you already have a season pass you just go to the front of the line and check-in. If not, and it's your first race, allow time to register and get your RFID chip.



Fast and Accurate Race Results

The new digital race timing system that incorporates both RFID chips and photo finish software has been working well. The software will automatically compute everyone's finish times and time trial times. The photo finish software will allow race officials to determine finishing sequences when the RFID system indicates a tie. Race results are generally available on the website within a few hours and the new software presents additional information that you'll find fun and interesting.

The new RFID chips take the place of race bibs so no more sticking pins in your jerseys and jackets. No more bibs flapping in the wind. The chips are a very bright color that corresponds to your race category. You can easily spot others in your race category because they have the same colored chip as you. Chips must be mounted on the right fork close to the axle parallel to the wheel and be held in place so that it doesn't move around and the number on the chip remains visible. If your chip is loose or isn't positioned correctly, it won't get detected. The zip ties we provide will hold the chip in the right position on most forks as long as they're tight. However, the shape of some forks require the use of o-rings to hold the chip in the right position and we recommend using o-rings if in doubt. O-rings are available at the start for \$1/pair.

Board Meeting Minutes—April 2, 2018

Meeting called to order at 6:08 pm Venue: Jethros's Bar & Grill, 1281 Kimmerling Rd, Gardnerville, NV 89410

Minutes of the March 2018 meeting approved

1. Monthly Status Reports:

- Treasurer: The current checking account balance is: \$4,544.50. The PayPal account balance is \$10,480.13. Frank shared that we may need to move money from PayPal to the bank account before the end of April.
- Membership: Current membership is 163. Todd shared that emails have gone out to ALL members to re-up their membership.
- Weekend Rides: Rick says the schedule is planned and is being posted through July. He has contacted April Wolfe about the Project Hero ride. Rick asked the board if they wish to sponsor this ride and all agreed.
- Social Media: Corby shared that he has created an Instagram account for the club #altaalpinacycling and is asking for any pictures to post. He has also updated the Facebook page with info from the AACC page. Corby asked if money is available boost posts on Facebook. This to be added to new business for discussion and possible motion at the next meeting.
- Newsletter: Discussion by the group with a decision to have the newsletter out after the first race so updated race info can be included.
- Website: Jim added spring party info to the site, posted ride maps, and is adding the race schedule.
- Weekly Road Races: Michael asked the board to approve a budget of \$340 to print posters of the race calendar, pay for Webscorer software and O-rings. Moved by Frank, second Alisa, all agreed. Michael informed everyone that the insurance and porta potty fees have increased significantly such that the race budget is \$5700 and we need to increase race fees in order to break even. There was much discussion by all suggesting punch cards, increasing season pass fees across the board by 10% and 20%, ROP paying for the insurance fees only, and increasing non-member fees. The board asked Micheal to work through the numbers and distribute a proposal to the board. Alisa suggested online registration with the

- ability to purchase a race online to help increase number of attendees and income. Michael will investigate this.
- Junior Team: Carlo shared that preseason opens April 1st and the ride season begins July 1st. Carlo handed out flyers that have been created to help recruit junior team participants. This is the 3rd year for the team and last year there were 18 kids.
- Insurance: Michael reported that the Challenge insurance policy has finally been issued however insurance certificates have still not been delivered to us. Permit applications for the Challenge cannot be submitted without these certificates so permitting is now 5 weeks behind schedule.
- Bike Advocacy: Carlo shared that the annual meeting for the Carson Valley Trails Association is tomorrow night. Amgen tour is set to come through our area Friday May 18th and they need volunteers. Carlo is working on getting international visibility for rides in our area. There are three contested Douglas County Commission races this year and not all of the candidates are supportive of the cycling community. Cyclists should try to learn more about the candidates' positions on issues that affect the cycling community. Most of these races will be decided in the June Primary NOT in November elections.
- Adopt A Highway: Alisa shared that she has been in contact with Tammy DeGiovanni about getting the supplies and that CalTrans has her info.
- Clothing: Lori will be at the party with the clothing.
- Challenge: Michael shared that marketing efforts are going well.
- Spring Party: Discussion was had by all about the spring membership party on April 11th. Tod is asking bike shops to donate prizes and board members to staff tables. Michael asked the board to approve a budget of \$640 to fund the membership party. Motion by Tammy Lundquist and 2nd by Alisa Ashbaugh, Unanimous approval.
- Next Meeting: Monday, May 7, 2018, 6 pm, [Ed Note: Now rescheduled for May 21] The Timbers Restaurant, Lakeside Casino, Stateline Meeting adjourned at 7:43 pm
