This year the Wild Sierra will take place on June 29, 2013. Please mark your calendars now (the ones on your wall and the one in your phone) for that week. As you know, this is the club's biggest event of the year and we need everyone to help out to make it happen.

Planning is well under way for this year's event. We already have a team of pre-event volunteers working on all aspects of the ride.

**New for 2013**: The Alta Alpina 8 Pass Challenge—The World's Toughest Double Century will be part of the 2013 California Triple Crown Stage Race. We have a maximum of 499 spots and we hope to sell out this year.

Laura Caimi is heading up marketing efforts again for 2013. Posters and flyers have been printed and are being distributed--but we're looking for more volunteers to help get them out. 

## **Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Leaders Awarded**

CARSON CITY, Nev. – Nevada bicycling and pedestrian resources were recently recognized by the Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board's annual awards program.

The awards, presented at the Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Summit in Las Vegas, single out individuals, agencies and groups for improving bicycle and pedestrian facilities, safety and advocacy.

"Bicycling and walking offer many benefits. They make us as individuals and families healthier and they connect and enhance communities and reduce congestion and vehicle emissions," board chairman Dennis Stark said. "Whether you have personally walked or bicycled a Nevada roadway or trail, or simply reaped the societal benefits, you've got these winners' dedication and hard work to thank. From safe biking, the winners have helped give our state more means of transportation. Our communities and commutes are better for it."

Bicyclists and pedestrians currently make up to 12 percent of all trips in the U.S. With proven environmental, economic and health benefits, the public demand for bicycling and walking opportunities is growing. Bicycling and pedestrian planning across the state have shown a surge in public interest in bicycling and walking, with more than half of vehicle users surveyed saying they would drive less if other forms of commuting were available.

The Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board was created by the Nevada Legislature to advise state agencies on policies, programs and facilities, as well as promote programs and facilities for the safe use of bicycles and pedestrians in the state. The board consists of 14 members appointed by the Governor. More information is available at (775) 888-7433 (RIDE).

  - Weekend Rides: Shooting to start with some short rides in March. Will look to hold to have a bike repair clinic. Dave Scarborough initiated as new Weekend Ride Director. Need Hillacious Coordinator.
  - Newsletter: We'll have a Jan/Feb Newsletter.
  - Website: Will reach out to current website coordinator to ensure timely updates.
  - Weekly Road Races: No update.
  - Mountain Bike Races: No update.
  - Junior Team: Club purchased 6 sets of Kreitler rollers with resistance units and platforms for \$1450. Juniors are training Mondays indoors and Thursdays on weights.
  - Spring Century: Looks to be same as last year:

- Carson Valley Classic: No update. Will likely see if Little City Stage Race wants some help.

# 6. Monthly Status Reports:

- Treasurer: As of 02/04/13 our bank balance is \$48,579.88. We have just over \$9,000 in the paypal account. We wrote checks for sponsorships and purchased rollers for the junior team. The transition on the paypal account still needs to happen. If we have the debit card reissued in Frank's name and the number changes, there are a few accounts that must be notified. In this transitionary period, board agrees to leave Peter on as a signatory to make signing checks easier for Mel. The Sacherman Fund helped fund the junior team velodrome trip and rollers leaving \$500 and change to be used and we must prepare a report for them.
- Membership: Four memberships renewed online. All the honorary memberships have been processed. Three memberships are waiting to be processed. Tentative spring kick off party on April 14th to be held at the Elks Club again.
- Insurance: Paperwork has been submitted to the League of American Bicyclists. Robert needs a check to pay them. This insurance (\$506) covers all our bike "rides," time trials and the Board of Directors. In effect, it covers all club activities except racing. Robert sent in the paperwork regarding our event (\$1301) and race insurance through HCM Event Insurance. We'll get a check from Frank to them immediately. Our Weekly Road Race Series insurance is separate.
- Weekend Rides: Hoping to do a Beginner's Ride from Genoa to Faye-Luther just to get folks out in March. Considering a fix-a-flat clinic afterwards. Also considering two Sonora Rides: one that includes just the front side and one that is front and back. Dave would also like to do a ride over Donner Summit to Cisco Grove (55-60ish miles). Dave would like to some money appropriated for Packsaddle Pass and other group rides. Lauren will send out some emails this week and see if we can get our weekly rides sponsored.
- Newsletter: We just need a presidential posting and the minutes from tonight and the newsletter for this month is ready to go!.
- Wild Hillacious: Coordinator still needed.
- · Website: Send updates re: website to Joe.

- Weekly Road Races: WIll start April 18th.
- Junior Team: A few new interested kids. Some of the kids who have been MIA are showing back up. Purchased 6 rollers for the JR Team.
- Spring Century: Mike and Maggie H have agreed to host the Spring Century again. Dave motions that we comp their membership for the year. Motion passes. The ride will take place on Memorial Day weekend again. There will be a 8 AM start and a 11 AM start just out to Diamond Valley Rd for beginners. Fall Century will tentatively be held the 2nd Sunday of October.
- Pinenut Cracker: May 18th. Kevin Joell/Sierra Cup Series is Race Director. We will be setting up stakes/signs. Insurance will be through Reno Wheelman.
- Carson Valley Classic: No firm confirmation on if Bubba's Stage Race will be held again.
- King of Kingsbury Time Trial: No update.
- Cyclocross Race: Season is over. Scott request a plaque for the sponsor for this year's Cyclocross Race.
- Adopt A Highway: Tammy Lundquist volunteered to run Adopt a Highway.
- Clothing: 12 PRO Jerseys, Bibs, Shoe Covers and 36 Elite Men's SS Jsys. Dave motions that we approve this order as stated. Board agrees.
- 7. Alta Alpina Challenge: 122 registered participants. Michael has requested that one specific branch of the Forest Service be our go-to for the permitting process. He is still waiting to hear the answer. Back up will be that we run our Forest Service permits as we normally do. Turtle Rock Park is available and reserved for us. We will need more volunteers than before for the event because of the race aspect. Projected profit for 2013 if we sell out: \$12,000-20,000. Mel suggests that Michael find an assistant to train this year that can act as race director the next year in the event that he moves.
- 8. **E&O Insurance:** Board agrees to purchase E+O Insurance for the year to protect the board members for the year at cost of \$550.00.
- 9. **Next Meeting:** Monday, March 4, 2013, 6 pm, Design Workshop on Market St. in Stateline.
