#### NICA Junior Mountain Bike Racing

Alta Alpina club members, you have a new acronym to learn. You may have heard the term NICA (National Interscholastic Cycling Association – <u>nationalmtb.org</u>). What is it, you ask? This is a cross country mountain bike program for students from 6th through 12th grade. Nevada's league started in 2016 with Alta Alpina Composite fielding a team of students in the Carson Valley coached by our own Mel Maalouf. Our second season we added more students from South Lake Tahoe under the watch of coach Andrew Bray.

There are no requirements to join the team other than a good

attitude and a desire to learn and have fun. Group training rides will start in July and are scheduled 2-3 times per week at various Carson Valley or South Lake Tahoe trails. All students are invited to participate in the race series which will take place at different cross-country venues over four weekends in the fall.

Parents and other adults who meet the registration requirements can volunteer to coach by joining in on the weekly rides. What better way to give back to our sport than getting the next generation of riders excited about riding. Look for our hashtag **#morekidsonbikes** on social media and our blue and yellow Alta Alpina jerseys on the trails.

#### Season Recap from Coach Lori Kroboth:

The Alta Alpina Composite-Nevada Interscholastic Cycling League team had a strong showing for the last race of the season on October 15th, held at Tahoe Donner Adventure Center. The second-year team is made up of 6th-12th graders from both the Carson Valley and South Lake Tahoe area.

Each 4.2 mile lap wound through the very scenic Tahoe Donner trail system. All racers worked very hard and were able to finish the course.

Three riders made it to the podium for individual race results. Sawyer Villanueva took 3rd in the Middle School Girls division. Lachlan Bray took 5th in the Middle School Boys, and Justin Kinser finished less than 1 second behind the leader to take 2nd in the JV Boys division.

Justin was crowned League Champion for the JV Boys after earning the most points overall during the season. Sawyer took 3rd overall in the League Series for Middle School Girls after finishing 1st for one race and

finishing 3rd for two more.

#### 1. Monthly Status Reports:
