# Board Meeting Minutes—January 4, 2021

Meeting held by Zoom Call

Called to order at 6:01 pm

### 1. Monthly Status Reports:

- **Treasurer**: The current checking account balance is: \$12,502.72. The PayPal account balance is \$16,454.90. Frank reported that he is still working on the CA state filings and tax filings. Frank will meet with Lori before the next meeting to work on this. Alpine County Chamber of Commerce has sent us an invoice for 2021 and it was agreed that we should maintain our membership.
- **Membership**: Current membership is all in Grace Period. Allen will work with Tod on the new

Membership Waiver form which is needed so we can open renewals for 2021.

- Weekend Rides: No recent ride activity. Leon will connect with all the gang of ride leaders and will post rides in the meantime.
- **Social Media**: Gregg is monitoring social media accounts but there is little activity right now.
- **Newsletter**: The next newsletter will be after the February board meeting. Michael will circulate January meeting minutes before the next meeting
- Website: Jim updated the home page and asks board members to let him know if any other pages need updating.





- **Insurance**: Michael will be contacting the LAB regarding the onerous waiver requirements to request simplification. Insurance rates and details will be released by the LAB in a few weeks and
- renewal is due before the next board meeting so Michael will be contacting club officers for approval of the insurance premium when the 2021 quotes are available.
- **Clothing**: Bruce is taking over from Lori. He will work with Lori to transfer the inventory.
- Weekly Road Races: Joseph received a box of prizes donated by Strava. There isn't enough to cover last year's winners so he is working on plans for using these prizes. Joseph will continue to organize off-season time trial challenges.
- Junior Team: Carlo reported that the team received a donation from Athletes United.
- **Spring Century**: Chris will work with Dave Scarborough and Michael Bayer to get going.
- Adopt A Highway: No Report.
- **Pinenut Cracker**: Brian hasn't heard from the BLM. While a May 2021 event won't happen, we need to know where we stand with the BLM for permitting the PNC course.
- **Challenge**: Michael is working on budgeting for the 2021 Challenge. It is now clear that the 2021 event will have to be another "Covid Edition". As

we already have a significant number of registered participants, he is working on determining what limits we will need to place on registration for a Covid-19 Edition before we open registration to more people and develop an appropriate marketing strategy.

- **Mixed Terrain**: Given forecasts for vaccination holding scheduled events in the fall is not a practical goal. Instead Michael is working on a virtual event approach as discussed at the last board meeting. Insurance and Jerseys are the critical items.
- **Bike Advocacy**: Carlo reported that Centerville Road is under construction. Culverts have been widened which will allow for future addition of bike lanes. Carlo also suggested that we check out the Pinenut Peddler Project which maps additional mixed terrain routes through the Pinenuts.
- 2. **Budget 2021:** 2020 wasn't a normal year for expenses so this year's budgeting exercise will need to draw from both 2019 and 2020. Frank will get numbers to Lori who will get numbers out to coordinators to draft the first pass at the budget.
- Next Meeting: Monday, February 1, 2021, 6 pm, by Zoom Call. Nigel will circulate the details. Meeting adjourned at 7:16 pm

# Board Meeting Minutes—February 1, 2021

Meeting held by Zoom Call

Called to order at 6:03 pm

Minutes of the January meeting approved as presented [Nigel/Bruce/Unanimous]

### 1. Monthly Status Reports:

• **Treasurer**: The current checking account balance is: \$10,481.50. The PayPal account balance is \$16,663.14. Lori is unable to continue as Treasurer at the moment so Michael will ask Jennie to step in as Acting Treasurer until Lori can resume. Frank remains deputy treasurer and is still working on getting caught up with past records and filings. He will work with Jennie and Bruce to get this wrapped up as soon as possible.

- **Membership**: Current membership is still in Grace Period. Allen is working with Dennis and Michael on the new membership renewal process. Michael's top priority is getting the renewal notices with the new waivers emailed to everyone. These will go out in batches.
- Weekend Rides: Leon has been contacting ride leaders to set a ride calendar for the year.
  Waivers will be required from every unrenewed member however as there aren't too may rides





in the spring, it was agreed that the grace period will remain through the end of April.

- MTB Weekly Rides: No report.
- Social Media: Gregg is gearing up for promoting the challenge through our social media accounts.
- **Newsletter**: The February newsletter will go out after renewal notices. The first newsletter of the year will feature member profiles for the new board members. Michael will need a presidential posting and other submissions.
- Website: Jim will remove the old membership agreement PDF from the website.
- **Insurance**: Michael reported that after email approval from the board, the LAB insurance policies for General Liability and Directors/ Officers was renewed for 2021. Cost of the policies has increased over 2020 but many of our larger concerns have been addressed.
- **Clothing**: Michael is helping to get Lori and Bruce connected so Bruce can get the existing clothing inventory. Drew is still reviewing options for 2021 clothing vendor for the NICA team uniforms.
- Weekly Road Races: Joseph is working to archive the 2020 results and updated the webpage for the 2021 race season. He is also wrapping up the January Challenge and getting ready to kick off the February off-season challenge. The 2021 race calendar is expected to be the same as it was in 2020. Leon asked about getting help from Strava and Joseph confirmed that there doesn't seem to be any type of telephone support..
- Junior Team: Drew reported that the local NICA leagues are starting to gear up and team coaches are getting re-engaged for the 2021 training season. One new challenge is that buying bikes has become difficult. He reported that mountain bike dealers are seeing 8-12 month lead times for new bikes. Specialized is taking orders for delivery beyond 12 months and Trek is reporting 84-100 day lead times. Apparently the production of bikes is being constrained by the availability of components.
- Spring Century: Chris proposed moving the event to May 22.
- · Adopt A Highway: No Report.
- **Pinenut Cracker**: Brian reported that he was able to make contact with the BLM and the permit

process for a 2022 event looks good.

- **Challenge**: Michael is still working on budgeting for the range of possible 2021 Challenge scenarios. The board decided that we should open a waiting list for Challenge registration. Michael will contact Dennis to get this implemented.
- **Mixed Terrain**: The jersey design has been finalized but Voler will not add it to the collection of jerseys they currently produce for our event participants. Voler was the only company that was willing to work with us on an inventory-free approach and they have backed away from this program. Michael is still negotiating with them on an arrangement that can work.
- Bike Advocacy: Carlo reported that the Carson Valley Trails Association's next big trail project is connecting the Clear Creek Trail from at Jacks Valley elementary school to James Lee Parkapproximately 10 miles of new trail. The trail layout is complete and awaiting a USFS environmental impact assessment. Trail work could begin in a year or so. He also reported that work is underway to identify opportunities for "Bike specific trails" which are open to all users but designed to attract cyclists but be unattractive to others. CVTA is looking at partnering with TAMBA for a trail like this. Another approach is having directional trails paired to existing trails where there is a suggested direction to create uphill/downhill loops for cyclists.

Carlo is also pushing for an updated Douglas County trails plan which hasn't been updated since 2003). Construction on a two mile trail connecting the ponds in Minden and Gardnerville ponds should start in the summer. The Nevada Legislative session has started and there is an initiative that relates to e-bike regulation on state lands.

- 2. **Budget 2021:** Frank will complete tallying numbers from 2020 and generate a report that aligns with the budgeting template. The goal is for all board members to bring their budgeting numbers for 2021 to the next meeting.
- 3. **2021 Calendar:** Nigel asked Michael to update last year's annual calendar of events for 2021.
- Next Meeting: Monday, March 1, 2021, 6 pm, by Zoom Call. Nigel will circulate the details. Meeting adjourned at 7:31 pm
