Bicycle Legislation Update

Carlo Luri, Bicycle Advocacy

There is some federal legislation proposed that would benefit cyclists. For anyone interested in exploring further, see below. Best way to show support would be to write your Senator or House representative.

Biking Long Distance Trails Act (House and Senate)

The Department of the Interior and the Department of Agriculture shall:

- identify not fewer than 10 long-distance bike trails;
- identify not fewer than 10 areas in which there is an opportunity to develop or complete long-distance bike trails; and
- coordinate with stakeholders on the feasibility of, and identifying any resources necessary for, completing the development of such trails.

National Discovery Trails Act

This bill amends the National Trails System Act to include national discovery trails as part of the national trails system. Such trails (1) shall be extended, continuous, interstate trails located to provide for outstanding outdoor recreation and travel and to connect representative examples of America's trails and communities; (2) shall provide for the conservation and enjoyment of significant natural, cultural, and historic resources and be so located as to represent metropolitan, urban, rural, and back country regions of the Nation; and (3) may be designated on federal lands and, with the owner's consent, on nonfederal lands.

The 6,000-mile American Discovery Trail extending from Cape Henlopen State Park in Delaware, to Point Reyes National Seashore in California, splitting into northern and southern routes near Cincinnati, Ohio, and rejoining at Denver, Colorado, is designated as a national discovery trail.

The bill sets forth requirements for designation of a trail as a national discovery trail.

The appropriate federal department for each national discovery trail shall (1) administer the trail in cooperation with at least one competent trailwide volunteer-based organization; and (2) submit a comprehensive plan for the trail's protection, management, development, and use.

Board Meeting Minutes—January 10, 2022

Meeting held via Zoom. Called to order at 6:02 pm

Minutes of the December meeting approved as revised and printed [Nigel/Bruce/Unanimous]

Monthly Status Reports:

Treasurer: The current checking account balance is: \$18,633.00. The PayPal account balance is \$12,502.36. Total \$31,135.36 of which \$1114 are NICA team funds. There are a number of outstanding expenses, some significant. These include the Storage Unit and USFS liabilities. Frank updated the board on the status of tax and other government filings.

Membership: Allen is working on an updated renewal process. The process will depend on LAB insurance requirements. Michael and Jennie will meet with Allen once these are known and develop a better system. Insurance details should be known by Jan 20.

Weekend Rides: Nigel will encourage Leon to line up a team of ride leaders for this year.

Weekly MTB Rides: MTB rides are on hiatus.

Social Media: Gregg is getting back online with the club's Facebook accounts. Questions from prospective Challenge participants are already coming in and Gregg is working on responses. Carlo reviewed the collection of accounts that we have, who we have as admins (Gregg / Jennie / Carlo / Mel / Dave S.), and plans for shutting down the unneeded pages.

Newsletter: The next newsletter will be the February newsletter which will have minutes for both January and February, renewal reminders, and coverage of other season topics. Michael will get the January minutes out to board members in time for the February board meeting.

Website: Early bird registration for the challenge is now showing on the home page. Member renewal is not active as we don't have a process in place yet.

Insurance: The annual LAB insurance conference call is scheduled for Jan 19 and the insurance must be renewed by Jan 31. Michael will get the details for the 2022 policies and send an email approval ballot to officers as this needs



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to be approved and purchased before the next board meeting.

Clothing: No new orders. Michael and Drew are working on finding new vendors.

Weekly Road Races: Joseph is working on getting back and testing all the racing chips and getting a survey out to racers that haven't been out to races recently.

Junior Team: Drew reported that the NV North NICA league needs a new director.

Spring Century: No Report. Fall Century: No Report.

Adopt A Highway: Jordan reported that he needs to get up to speed on the training. Jordan will connect with Thomas on training and Leon to coordinate dates.

Pinenut Cracker: Michael will check with Brian on the status of permits and dates.

Challenge: The Omicron variant has lead to labeling the 2022 Challenge as being another Covid Edition. The details for making it virus safe in 2022 will be determined based on the dominant variant(s) in circulation in June. Everyone in our database has been notified of the early bird

registration deadline and registrations have been rolling in. Marketing to new participants would be premature right now because of all the uncertainty that Omicron has brought back.

Death Ride Training Series: Michael volunteered to keep this effort moving forward while we work to recruit volunteers. Carlo volunteered to liaise with the Chamber.

Mixed Terrain: Most of our routes were impacted by fires and it's unclear when they will be deemed safe and permitable.

Bike Advocacy: Carlo provided an update on pending federal legislation. No recent progress on the Indian Hills trail efforts. Carlo suggested that the Bike Monkey Stetina event is still scheduled for May 19 and represents an opportunity for us to volunteer and learn from them.

Assistant Treasurer Position: Jennie Hamiter was appointed as Assistant Treasurer for 2022 [Nigell MichaellUnanimous]. In the role she will get Bill up to speed and coordinate with Frank.

Board Meeting Minutes—February 7, 2022

Meeting held by conference call.

Meeting called to order at 6:02 pm

Minutes of the January meeting approved as presented. [BillIMichaellUnanimous]

1. Monthly Status Reports:

Treasurer: The current checking account balance is: \$17,932.86. The PayPal account balance is \$15,301.84. The Paypal account balance reflects revenue from Challenge registrations. Outstanding expenses still include forest service liabilities, storage unit, undeposited reimbursement checks from 2021, 2022 insurance policies, website expenses, plus LAB and BRDAA memberships. The balance also includes \$1114.95 of NICA team funds. Frank gave another update on banking

and tax filing issues. Bill asked for all board members to submit budgets for their area of responsibility. Jennie will send Frank a full set of reconciled transactions through the end of 2021 so that he can get them into QuickBooks. Frank will meet with Bill and Jennie to work through the rest of the treasury hand-off up to speed on the QuickBooks hand-off. Frank has a meeting scheduled with the tax accountant for early March to start work on 2021 taxes.

 Membership: Michael shared news on the efforts to streamline and simplify the membership renewal process despite the continued insurance requirement for annual waivers. The consensus of the board was to proceed with sending out renewal notices for existing and expired members.



- Weekend Rides: Leon will put out a call for additional ride leaders to help lead rides this year. Michael will circulate calendar identifying weekends that need scheduled rides. Jennie reviewed what has gone into weekend ride planning in the past and offered to help Leon with planning a weekend ride scheduling meeting.
- Weekly MTB Rides: Nigel indicated that he planned to start scheduling MTB rides in April.
- Social Media: Gregg has posted multiple time for the Challenge and his efforts have been successful. Carlo worked with Laura to eliminate the defunct Facebook group so we now have the club and challenge pages. He is still working on the admins lists for Facebook.
- Newsletter: Michael is aiming to publish the newsletter in a week assuming that everyone can submit their content to him in time.
- · Website: Jim will get budget info to Bill.
- Insurance: Michael reported that the club's general liability and D&O insurance policies were renewed. He also reported back on why MTB rides require signed waivers for every ride while road rides do not. Michael needs to get quotes for racing insurance and for the Challenge.
- · Clothing: No report.
- Weekly Road Races: Joseph is finalizing the list of past-racers still living in the area in order to reach them with his survey. The race season will start in April.
- · Junior Team: No news to report.
- Spring Century: Will be held in the same format as last year (one rest stop in same location). May 21 is the planned date, but May

- 22 will be the backup date. Chris will review budget and confirm with Bill. Michael reviewed plans for the DRTS that day. Chris will post to Rideboard and details will be posted in the April newsletter.
- Adopt A Highway: Jordan is working on getting official training and he is meeting with the folks at the Woodfords Maintenance station for details. Jordan approved proposed dates on club calendar.
- **Pinenut Cracker**: Brian is waiting on the BLM.
- Challenge: Registrations rolling in, next steps are working on permits and stepping up marketing efforts. CVMC on board again. Leon observed that we need to revisit our SEO on the club/challenge website. Nigel asked everyone to submit search terms that Michael should work into the web pages.
- Death Ride Training Series: Michael is working to recruit volunteers to either help with coaching emails or help on the days of each ride. Carlo has been working with Chamber and will be following up with them along with contacts exploring the possibility of closed road events in the spring.
- **Bike Advocacy**: CVTA 25% complete on new Indian Hills trail..
- Club Calendar: Board reviewed the draft calendar that Michael circulated. We will skip the membership party again this year but we will hold the Spring Rider Roundup. Local school holidays will get added to the calendar for planning purposes.
