AACC Weekend Ride Schedule—Feb/Mar

There will be both fast and social pace versions of our weekend rides—just show up and join the group of your choice.

Members are encouraged to post their own rides to the club rideboard. The Alta Alpina rideboard is a fantastic way to link up with people to ride with. Thursday, February 27, 2020 — Diamond Valley Loop

Meet Leon at the Bottom of Kingsbury (Carson Valley side), ready to ride at 10:00am. This 30 mile ride out to Diamond Valley and back will be at a medium pace.

Saturday, February 29, 2020 — Genoa to Diamond Valley

Meet Jennie in Genoa at the Genoa Town Park on Nixon Street. (Nixon is the continuation of Genoa Lane.) This is an easy-paced, social ride on rolling terrain. If 40 miles is too much for early season, ride with us as far as you want and turn around - there may be others that want to do the same. Departure time from Genoa is noon.

Saturday, March 7, 2020 — Pinyon Trail

Meet Bill at the Pinenut/Pinyon trailhead, about 2 miles past Dump Road on the right. Be ready to roll at 2:00pm. This is a mountain bike ride on the Pinyon Trail which will be about 14 miles.

Saturday, March 14, 2020 — Trees to Grover Hot Springs

Meet Randy at the big trees at the corner of Fairview and Frederickburg, ready to ride at 11am. We'll ride to Grover Hot Springs via Fredericksburg and Carson River Road. Snacks available to purchase and bathrooms available in Markleeville.

Sunday, March 29, 2020 — To Ebbetts and Grover Hot Springs

Meet Leon in Woodfords, ready to ride at 10am. We'll ride to the base of Ebbetts then back to Markleeville for an out-and-back to Grover Hot Springs before returning to Woodfords (about 30 miles).

Sunday, April 4, 2020 — Virginia City

Meet at Governor's Fields, Carson City NV, at Roop and Evalyn. Be ready to ride at 11am. We'll take some nice bike routes through Carson City, then out US 50 and take the truck route up to Virginia City. The full ride includes the Lousetown loop (about 50 miles/4000ft), but in the past half the group turns around at Virginia City (about 35 miles/2000ft), so if you want to do that you'll probably have company for the ride back to Carson City.

Board Meeting Minutes—January 14, 2020

Meeting called to order at 6:05 pm Venue: Lakeside Inn & Casino

Approval of December 2019 Minutes [Nigel/Bill/Unanimous]

1. Monthly Status Reports:

- Treasurer: The current checking account balance is \$7,827.98. The Paypal balance is \$1470.03.
- Membership: Tod reported that he plans on organizing the Spring Party in the traditional format. We have reserved the CVIC hall but Tod is exploring alternatives in South Lake Tahoe.
- Weekend Rides: Bill will look into a proposed "Spring Rider Round-up" ride event on Satruday April 11. Bill will be confirming the weekend ride leaders for the first half of the 2020 ride season and will meet with them to set the weekend ride calendar. Between special events, the Training Ride Series, and highway cleanups, many weekends already have a scheduled weekend ride so we may be able to schedule a second complementary ride on some weekends. Rick has indicated that he is available for the second half of the season.
- Newsletter: As usual, there will be no January newsletter but Michael will distribute meeting minutes to the board members prior to the next meeting. The February newsletter will come out shortly after the February board meeting. Michael requested content for the first 2020 newsletter prior to that.
- Website: Jim is working to update all the pages with the new banner. The home page now has a link showing that registration is now open.
- Insurance: The board approved \$575 for the 2020 D&O insurance. [Nigel/Tod/Unanimous] Michael reported that the quote for general liability insurance will arrive in about 2 weeks and the board will need to to approve this by email

- vote as this needs to be purchase before the end of the month..
- Weekly Road Races: Joseph is working through all the race gear and materials. He is contacting people who have not returned chips after the 2019 season so they can be tested and refurbished or replaced as necessary.
- Junior Team: Carlo reported that planning for the 2020 NICA season is underway. Recruiting for new families (students and coaches) will kickoff in April. Riding starts in July with four league races later in the year.
- Adopt A Highway: Thomas has confirmed all the dates on the proposed calendar.
- Pinenut Cracker: Brian reports that the fairgrounds are available for our desired date but his meeting with the BLM did not got well and we may have to postpone to May 2021.
- Mixed Terrain: The first phase of the new website for the mixed terrain series is up and running at CVAdventureRides.org. This version of the website emphasizes the Carson Valley as the ultimate destination for mixed terrain riding with 16 year-round rides. Michael is requesting feedback on the website.
- Challenge: The Challenge website has been completely overhauled addressing all the feedback received in past years and making it mobile-friendly. There are all new maps, profiles, GPX files, and details. Dennis Pederson has been working through the holidays to rewrite the interactive registration software featuring the training series and other add-on options new for 2020. The design for everything ties into the other marketing materials including print ads, social media ads, postcards, and posters. The board approved \$375 for posters and postcards. [Michael/Nigel/Unanimous]
- Bike Advocacy: Carlo is working with a group looking to bring the International Trails





Symposium to Reno in 2021. Carlo also reported that work is continuing on the trail from Minden to Reno on the Virgina and Truckee Trail based on the path of the V&T railway. Carlo also reported on efforts to add bike lanes to Centerville Road during planned repaving efforts. Douglas County will be reviewing the county trails plan in 2020 so there will likely be an opportunity for the club to contribute and integrate the new mixed terrain year-round routes.

- **Spring Century**: Lee announced that the Spring Century start/finish will be at Nigel's house this year. We'll park the mobile porta potty there.
- Social Media: Gregg has updated and made postings on the club and Challenge Facebook page. He hasn't been able to update the Instagram or Twitter accounts..
- 2. **Death Ride Agreement:** Nigel reviewed the draft contract with Alpine County Chamber of Commerce

- regarding the 2020 Death Ride Training Ride Series. He proposed some changes to the Chamber and is awaiting a new draft.
- 3. Review of Draft Club Calendar: The board reviewed the latest draft of the club's 2020 calendar. It was decided to switch the date for The Brunswick to October 10 and the date of the fall century to the weekend of October 3. Training series dates were also swapped around. Board meeting locations for the balance of the year were decided.
- Budgeting: Lori will consolidate all the individual project/group budgets. Board members should submit spreadsheets with the 2020 budgets they are responsible for to her.

Meeting called to order at 6:08 pm Venue: Jethros, Gardnerville Ranchos Approval of January 2020 Minutes [Tammy/Nigel/ Unanimous]

1. Monthly Status Reports:

- Treasurer: The current checking account balance is \$9514.92. The Paypal balance is \$4791.36. Frank exported numbers from the 2019 accounting system to get Lori started with budgeting.
- Membership: The spring party is scheduled for South Lake Tahoe. Tod has reserved the American Legion Hall for \$50.
- Weekend Rides: Bill organized a ride on Saturday that was well attended. Bill held a first meeting of ride leaders to begin setting the calendar for the 2020 season.
- Newsletter: Michael will get the January/ February newsletter completed as soon as possible. Submissions would be greatly

appreciated.

- Website: Challenge link has been updated and meetings are being updated. Jim has updated all the HTML pages and is moving on to the banners for the PHP pages. Jim paid for 3 years of domain name registrations.
- Insurance: Renewal of the General Liability
 Insurance policy was approved by the board by
 email votes. General Liability insurance was
 slightly up at \$1076.90. This is based on the
 number of members we expect for the year.
 We'll top up this number as our membership
 count increases. We're deferring property
 insurance for the time being. We're still waiting
 on quotes for race insurance and event
 insurance.
- Weekly Road Races: Joseph prepared and distributed a proposed budget for the 2020 race series. The Webscorer subscription needs to be renewed before April 10. Joseph will coordinate with Lori to get this paid.



- Junior Team: Drew presented a report on the status of the NICA team. The team is still growing and they are planning some pre-season activities and an enhanced training program to support the diversity of skill levels. Nigel suggested that the Juniors should be encouraged to cross train in the Thursday evening races.
- · Adopt A Highway: No report.
- Pinenut Cracker: Efforts to get a permit for May 2020 were unsuccessful and the calendar for the fall is already full. The focus now should be making it happen for May 2021.
- Mixed Terrain: Michael reported that he and Carlo met with management of Douglas County and we have their support. Michael will be presenting to the Douglas County Parks & Recs commission as a follow-up. We now have the support of CVMC which has agreed to help recruit volunteers, provide rider give-aways, provide rehydration stations, and encourage employees to participate. Michael is also meeting with local hotels and other groups. Michael is looking for feedback on the website to incorporate into the next iteration. Ads for the project are running in Cycle California and Adventure Sports Journal.
- Challenge: Dennis Pederson has been working really hard to further refine the version of the website for mobile devices and Michael has been rewriting the registration processing/CRM system to reflect all the new ride options and all the email confirmations and email follow-ups. We're recruiting volunteers to distribute posters and cards at events and with in-person visits to bike stores and other locations. Ads are running in

- Cycle California and Adventure Sports Journal. Gregg has been handling social media but he's only on Facebook right now.
- Bike Advocacy: Carlo is following up with Douglas County regarding the use of GIS information to help identify all the landowners near the path of the mixed terrain routes.
- Spring Century: Lee has review the maps prepared by Michael and is exploring the possibility of having posters to help promote the event to help grow membership.
- Social Media: Gregg submitted a report by email as he is traveling. He has been unable to access the club's Twitter and Instagram accounts. Carlo will contact Kimberly to see if we can get her help to get back control of the accounts.
- Training Ride Series: Nigel reported that all is set with our agreement with the Chamber.
 People are starting to register for the series.
 Frank will connect with the Chamber and work with Michael on details. Michael has prepared detailed GPX files to send to participants just prior to the rides (assuming that there are no last minute changes).
- 2. Alta Alpina Challenge Budget: Michael distributed copies of the proposed budget for the event These included low and high registration numbers with estimated revenue and expenses for each scenario. Budget was approved [Michael/Bill/Unanimous]. Lori will incorporate it into the club budget.
