

Another free event for members, the Alta Alpina Fall Century is the last big ride of the year. The out-and-back




ride from Wellington to Bridgeport features a rest stop coming and going and a Pizza Dinner at the finish.
















Tahoe Area Radio Association HAM CRAM Saturday April 27

Are you interested in getting a HAM Radio license? It's really useful to have in case of any kind of emergency—not just for Alta Alpina events. The Tahoe Amateur Radio Association (TARA) has invited us to a special training event on April 27 to fast-track getting HAM radio licenses. This is how many Alta Alpina members obtained their licenses.

The "HAM CRAM" day takes place at the fire station in Zephyr Cove from 9:30am to 4:30pm. Participants will review exam questions from 9:30 to 2:00, take the test from 3:00 to 4:30pm, and then get their license if they pass.



Board Meeting Minutes—March 4, 2024

Meeting held by Zoom Meeting called to order at 6:02 pm

1. Monthly Status Reports:

- Treasurer: The current checking account balance is \$8768.97. The Paypal balance is \$13,542.64. CDs are currently at \$10,118.16 and \$10,392.89. We received three \$160 payments for the Challenge via PayPal in February. We received three checks from Gannett for DRTS for a total of \$960. Frank will work with Bill to make the tax filings.
- Membership: The soft launch of the new membership renewal system has begun. All board members should be using the system to retrieve their 2024 waivers and returning them signed to Allen. As soon as we've validated the system with a few members we'll generate email renewal notices and notify members via the newsletter.
- Weekend Rides: We had a ride in February and as soon as the roads are clear again Lyn will schedule more. Lyn is planning a ride leaders meeting for this month and is looking for a venue.
- Weekly MTB Rides: No report.
- Social Media: Michelle is taking over from Gregg and will meet with Michael to get set up on the accounts and to plan a social media campaign.
- Newsletter: The next newsletter is scheduled for the second half of March.
- Website: Greg reported that he is working on a new club calendar page and he is inviting everyone to try out. He's also modernizing the website and will be seeking input on these changes. Jim will be handing off control of the Blue Host account to Greg.
- Insurance: Insurance payments were completed. Remaining insurance is the race insurance.
- Weekly Road Races: The Grandview HOA is happy with the dates and we're on good terms

- for this year. 10 replies received for the women's series proposal. Feedback suggested a Saturday series might be better received but Joseph is still looking for more feedback. Lani will forward the proposal to her women's distribution list. Joseph will work on getting posters printed and distributed. Tony Parenti proposed switching the last two races and there was a brief discussion around this. The decision was to poll the racers towards the end of the season.
- Bike Advocacy: Zach Wood introduced himself as our new bicycle advocacy coordinator.
- Clothing: There were no online sales of existing inventory in the past month. All inventory will be at the Spring Party and Rider Roundup at the discounted prices. The online clothing store for brand new club kits will stay open through the Spring Rider Roundup.
- Spring Century: Chris reported that there's just two and half months to go. Maps will need to be updated to reflect the new start/finish at Nigel's house. Chris will have something in the next newsletter. New name will be Annual Memorial Ride and BBQ. [Editorial Note: In a subsequent vote, board changed the name to Annual Memorial Cyclorama and BBQ.]
- NICA Team: No report.
- Adopt A Highway: Jordan has been working with Caltrans. New equipment has been ordered and new signs are also expected.
- Challenge: Michael is working on permits.
- Training Series: The Alpine County of Chamber of Commerce is doing a great job promoting the series and we're on track to sell out as we already have 24 riders signed up.
- 2. Alpine County Partnership: Michael, Bruce, and Bill will work on final text for the agreement with the Chamber [BrucelBillIUnanimous].
- 3. **Next Meeting:** Monday April 1, 6 pm, by Zoom. Meeting adjourned at 7:40pm
