It gets updated automatically if you check the AACC Weekend Ride box when you post, change, or cancel a ride on the Ride Board.

# Board Meeting Minutes-March 10, 2009

Secretary: Lauren Lindley; Other Board Members: Michael Bayer, Diane Bolton, Robert Braun, Pete Costa, David Gaskin, Jennie Hamiter, Dennis Pederson, Tim Rowe; Other Attendees: Corey Bolton, Craig Steele, Corey Welsh

1. Alta Alpina Challenge: The Alpine County Sheriffis department is not returning calls. CHP has implied that they are going to require a 9:00 PM cut off time. Michael has prepared a presentation regarding their concerns and has not heard back from them yet. Discussion of possible pricing changes to accommodate CHP fees: \$100 for 8 pass riders, \$85 for 5-6 pass riders, \$60 for 1-4 passes; \$30 for Kid Carson. Create an email address for club members to report road hazards on the course in the weeks prior to the course roadhazards@altaalpina.com We are going to encourage members to lead "Road Hazard Rides." Pete requests a bi-weekly report on expenses and incoming revenue to keep a tab on the event expenses. Corey will go to Alpine County with form needed to borrow signs per an old contract that stipulated they would allow local groups to borrow the signs.

- 2. Vacant Membership Coordinator Position: Pete Costa makes a motion to appoint as Patti Towns as the new membership chairman. Motion passes.
- 3. **2009 Budget:** Pete motions that we accept the 2009 budget with addition of \$100 for gifts given, \$750 for donations, leave mountain bike race

series budget as is, and increase the size of the storage shed, hopefully without increasing the cost in the budget, decrease the newsletter budget to \$3000, and raise the income of the CVC to \$12,500.

- 4. Annual Financial Report to the Membership: Jennie needs this for the membership newsletter.
- 5. New Accountant Search: The accountants we have used for the last past years are no longer in business. Pete has spoken with two possible firms in the Gardnerville area that are familiar with our club and can do work for non-profits. Meetings are set to introduce them to our books and get a cost quote. Our return this year with the IRS will be significantly easier because our incoming revenue was less than \$25K.
- 6. **Tax Exempt Status:** We are not a 501(c)3 we are a 501(c)4. Pete would like to make this an item agenda for the fall when there is less to discuss.
- 7. **Appointment of a new Paceline Editor:** Jennie Hamiter was appointed the new Paceline editor.
- 8. **Review Club Flyer for Bike Shops:** Was waiting for Gardnerville 100 date. Will print without the Gardnerville 100 date. Winter topics should be updated to reflect spring topics as we've moved later into the year.
- 9. **Merchant List:** Pete is going to attempt to add more merchants to our list.
- 10. Club PayPal Account: Pete would like to set up a donation account through PayPal.com so that if someone would like to make a donation it is easy and accessible via the web. Fees are minimal and competitive with merchant account services. Pete makes a motion that we look into placing a link to a PayPal account on the website for this purpose. To be followed up at the next meeting.
- 11. Review Mission Statement and Job Descriptions: To be moved to the next meeting.
- 12.**E&O Insurance:** \$550 quote from the League of American Cyclists was competitive and standard. It covers if we are hiring someone and then paying them for their services and they sue us for discrimination, or if a volunteer tries to sue us for discrimination of some sort. We may revisit this for 2010 but there is no reason to look into it this year.

#### 13. Monthly Status Reports:

- Treasurer's Report: As of 2/17/09, \$44,306.94. We did cash in our CD.
- **Memberships**: No members for 2009. Spring Membership party on April 20th will be our big

membership drive since things have kicked off late. Pete's wife will organize a bike swap.

- Weekend Rides: Show and Go Rides Rides to be printed in the Paceline with a disclaimer: "Rides are subject to change or cancellation. Please check the ride board for updates."
- Newsletter / Media Relations: Jennie can take input for the Paceline up to a week before the board meeting. Pete would like to see more information from the club go out to local newspapers. In addition, a welcome to new members and an old members Lost & Found column.
- Website: We need some new photos. Dennis has been bogged down with new site creation for the Challenge. "Classified Ads" page to be deleted as it is not utilized.
- Weekly Road Races: Schedule is ready. First race is April 23rd. Fees will be \$10 member/\$12 non members.
- MTB Race Series: MTB Race or Ride series to be tentatively held. Corey Welsh will look into possible new venues at the lake or Kirkwood.
- Junior Team: Mel not in attendance.
- **Gardnerville 100**: Keith is unable to host the Gardnerville 100 this year. Club to look for a new coordinator for spring event; if not we will move it to the fall.
- **Pine Nut Cracker**: Saturday, May 2nd. Flyers are ready. Unsure if we are still current in USA Cycling membership or not; needs to be looked into.
- **Bike Advocacy**: They are trying to change some laws in NV regarding cyclists hand signals and bike path uses. Bike to Work Month to be discussed next meeting.
- Adopt-A-Highway: Pete would like to add vegetation control to our duties on the highway once a year so that we can take care of weeds before the Challenge. Looking at a date in April/ early May to hold a litter pick up and then one or two weeks before we go out with weed whackers for the Challenge.
- **Clothing**: Garth not in attendance. Prices on jersey manufacturing has gone up. We need to change the prices on the jerseys to reflect the new prices: \$65.
- 14. **Next Meeting:** April 6, 2009 at 6:00pm at the Pizza Factory in the Ranchos.
