Sunday, June 10, 2007 — Markleeville to Mt. Reba

Climb beautiful Ebbetts Pass and Pacific Grade to Lake Alpine. Lunch at the Lake Alpine Lodge. Continue to Mt. Reba for a scenic view of the Mokelumne River canyon. Bring plenty of water and snacks for the ride. Enjoy a tall glass of restaurant grade iced tea at the lodge if you missed it on John Axtell's May ride. Wear your 2005 Death Ride jersey (or any other Death Ride jersey if you don't have the 2005 model). Meet in Markleeville at 8:30 am, ready to roll by 9:00 am. We will have a mixed pace of fast and slow riders.

Sunday, June 17, 2007 — Monitor East to West

Ride up the East Side of Monitor and down the west side and back to the start at a moderate to slow pace. Estimated distance for both sides is 38 miles. The starting point will be the dirt lot adjacent to the US Forestry station at the intersection of U.S. 395 and HWY 89; rolling at 9:00 am (sharp).



If you have never tried riding to work, try it this week. You'll get out in the cool morning hours, get your heart rate up a little so you feel better when you arrive at work, and you'll have burned a few more calories than if you'd sat in a car for those same miles.

Think of all the benefits of cycling to work:

- •"Save a dinosaur" (OK, save gas, and these days, that saves big bucks!)
- · Guarantee yourself a bike ride every day
- · Start the day with a cool ride into work in the morning
- Release some stress on your way home
- Reduce traffic congestion
- Improve air quality and reduce C02 emissions
- · Save on automobile maintenance costs
- Just generally put your commute time to better use I realize I'm lucky; I live a flat 4 miles from work, and March through November I ride to work almost every day. Or is it luck? Consider it the next time you're in the market for either a new home or a new job. Being within an easy bike ride to work improves your quality of life, so it's worth planning for!



But if work and home are too far apart to allow easy bike commuting, get creative. Try driving half way and then riding. Or, drive to work with your bike and then ride home one day, then ride to work the next day and drive home.

- 1. Monthly Status Reports:
 - Treasurer's Report: Dave Gaskin reports a bank balance of \$24,569.50.
 - Memberships: Michael reports a total of 165

 distributed a list of all expired memberships and
 requested the BOD members contact anyone
 they know on the list.
 - Newsletter: Editor Libby Oakden reports that the May newsletter is ready. Cycling related articles and weekend ride postings are always needed.
 - Weekend Rides: Director Tammy Lundquist reminded everyone about their ride leading commitments made at the Spring meeting. Tammy still needs more ride leaders to fill out the weekend ride schedule.
 - Thursday Night Races: Director Di Bolton reports a good turnout for the first two events despite the inclement weather. The ROP students participated at the Diamond Valley Race and were mentored to AACC rider Mark Hotchkin.
 - Twilight Mountain Bike Race Series: Director Michael Beam reports the first race went well with 25 participants riding in some chilly weather.
 - Bike Advocacy: The AACC BOD voted to appropriate \$125 for an advertisement to support another printing of the Carson City bicycle map. This map is published by the Muscle Powered group in Carson City to promote self-propelled transportation. Libby Oakden informed us that her employer, Bently-Nevada, will provide a free lunch to all their employees who ride to work on Ride Your Bike to Work Day.
 - Junior Team and Race Team: Mel was not present, so no Report.
 - Carson Valley Classic: Steve Thomsen reported that everything is ready. All we need is for the date and the racers to arrive. Steve has designed the T-shirt and believes it will be a hit
