We've gotten some questions on the increase in race fees. The increase is to help close the deficit in the race budget: they cover insurance, the port-a-potty, the race director's stipend, end of season awards, snacks, sodas, water, ice, and other miscellaneous items. AACC members race for \$8, non members \$10.

Member punch cards are \$56 for 8 races (save \$1 per race). If you purchase the full 16 races in advance it will be \$112 (save \$1 per race and race the last race for free). Board Meeting Minutes—May 4, 2009

Secretary: Lauren Lindley; Other Board Members: Michael Bayer, Twain Berg, Di Bolton, Pete Costa, Dave Gaskin, Jennie Hamiter, Garth Jackson, Tim Rowe

- 1. Alta Alpina Challenge: :Currently only at 10% of projected registration. Special board meeting to be held on May 17th to make final decisions regarding event based on current registration numbers. Question regarding ad in Cycle California: Cycle CA did not attend and distribute flyers as expected at major events they usually attend. This is seen as a loss of value for us. Saturday, May 16th is the Reno Bike Project Bike Swap. Alta Alpina has been invited to hold a free table at the swap to advertise the event. Mel Maalouf will tentatively attend as our spokesperson.
- Accountant Interviews and Vote: Pete Costa interviewed two different accountants to file our 2008 tax returns. Board voted and motion approved to hire Bill Johnson. He specializes in non-profit work and is a cyclist.
- 3. Spring Membership Party: Clothing sales went well (sold out of size large bib shorts). Budgeted \$1000 for the party and came in under \$600. Around 100 attendees. Twain requests that in the future we announce the need for weekend ride leaders at the beginning of the meeting.
- Minden Grill: Minden Grill has signed on as a club event sponsor.
- 5. Alpine County Bike/Pedestrian Plan: The Planner for the Alpine County Bike/Pedestrian plan has requested that the club be involved with the creation of the city plan. Alpine County is the only county in California that does not have a Bike/Ped plan. Pete is going to seek out a club member that is also a Alpine Co resident to be our contact person for the planning. Also, a member of the Douglas County planning board is asking for club support regarding the sale of a tract of land along Genoa Lane that is requesting the easement for the road/bike lane be removed as part of the new zoning as part of the sale to a land developer. They are trying to fight the change.
- Newspaper Articles: Di to email racers to see if anyone objects to printing their names in race results in local newspapers.
- Grant Status: The club has received a \$5,000 grant through the Silicon Valley Grant Foundation. It is intended for use for the Junior Team, road cleanup and community events.
- 8. Monthly Status Reports:
 - Treasurer's Report: The current balance is As of 4/17/09, \$35,626.29.
 - Memberships: Total members as of 5/3/09 is 120.
 From the party: 29 renewed, 6 New, 2 renewed from 2007 that were not members in 2008.
 - Weekend Rides: Weekend ride calendar is almost completely filled.

- Newsletter/Media Relations: Newsletter will go out this week. The June letter will probably be delayed until after the Challenge. Jennie requests that news articles be written with newer members in mind who might not know or recognize all of our event lingo.
- Website: Dennis has taught Twain how to make basic changes on the website and how to upload flyers and such.
- Weekly Road Races: 35 racers at the Foothill Time Trial. 52 racers at the Diamond Valley race. 2 went down: one racer with broken hand, one with broken collarbone and thumb. They are doing well.
- MTB Race Series: Board approves MTB race series
 to go on starting May 12th with race fees of \$5/\$10 for
 members/non-members. Board approves payment to
 Corey Welsh as race director for \$30/race + \$1 per
 participant.
- **Gardnerville 100**: Ride moved to Chris Z's house. Joe Marzocco is going to barbeque.
- Pine Nut Cracker: 67 riders attended. Robert reports
 we netted a profit of \$600. Requests that gift
 certificates be given to 8 key volunteers. Board
 motions and approves eight \$5 Starbucks cards for
 Robert's key volunteers.
- Junior Team: Has 1 new recruit.
- Carson Valley Classic: Proceeding as planned.
 Registration is open and flyers are on website.
- Kingsbury Time Trial: Permit sent in today for the Kingsbury Time Trial. Mel needs some signage and equipment out of the storage shed. First racer rolls at 10:00 AM on May 17th, 2009. USCF license is required to ride. Mel will be doing a Luther/Kingsbury loop afterwards if anyone would like to join him.
- Genoa Cyclocross: Need to find a new volunteer to run event for this year.
- Adopt-A-Highway: Weed whacking on June 6th.
- Bike Advocacy: Bike-to-Work Month is beginning. Tahoe has an event. An Alta Alpina team registered. Carson City and Bicycle Nevada are also promoting it. The Nevada Bike Board has given grant money to workplaces to promote cycling to work. May 20-21st, Bike Conference is at MontBleu. Lauren Lindley is attending on a scholarship on behalf of the club. There are 3 bicycle bills still alive in the NV legislature.
- Clothing: Prices were raised. Garth to provide an inventory to accountant.
- Next Meeting: Monday, June 1, 2009, 6 pm, Pizza Factory in Gardnerville.
