# TAMBA and the Caldor Fire

The Caldor Fire has impacted some of the most popular MTB trails in the lake basin including Powerline, Railroad Grade, Corral, Cedar, Sidewinder, Armstrong Connector, Armstrong, Mr. Toads, and Cold Creek. TAMBA is working to identify all of the impacted trails and and looking for funding to rebuild. TAMBA volunteers will work with the Forest Service to safely regain access to the burned areas to assess the trails and then begin planning and scheduling volunteer trail days to start making repairs. To stay in the loop on volunteer opportunities with TAMBA for Caldor Fire impacted trails, fill out the volunteer interest form on the TAMBA website and select "Caldor Fire Trail Repairs" as the project you are interested in.

TAMBA is also looking for people interested in becoming crew leaders and for sources of funding for the repairs including grants and donations. If you're interested in learning to be a crew leader visit the TAMBA website and sign up. Likewise if you're able to make a donation towards Caldor-related trail repairs you can do that on the TAMBA website (https://tamba.org) as well. Donations will reportedly be needed to help pay to repair things like damaged bridges and signs.

# Board Meeting Minutes-September 8, 2021

Called to order at 6:05 pm

Minutes of the August meeting approved as printed. [NigellLeonlUnanimous]

#### 1. Monthly Status Reports:

- **Treasurer**: The current checking account balance is: \$19,325.01. The PayPal account balance is \$11,667.65. Of which \$364 are NICA Funds. We should be getting a discount from United Site Services on the remainder of our race porta potty. Frank reported that our accountant cannot be reached due to the evacuation.
- **Membership**: Allan reports that there is nothing new to report.
- Weekend Rides: Leon reports that the weekend rides have been cancelled for the last couple of weeks due to smoke and evacuations. Leon is looking for ride leaders for the the two weekends while he will be away.
- **MTB Rides**: Forest closures have been extended in the lake basin which limits the venues for Tuesday MTB rides. The next ride will probably on the Nobel Canyon trail.
- **Social Media**: Gregg has been posting race cancellations, and other late breaking news as smoke and evacuations affect our plans.

- **Newsletter**: It was agreed that we should skip the September newsletter and publish the next newsletter immediately after the October board meeting..
- Website: Planned giving page is up. Jim is still waiting on input from Drew for the NICA pages. Leon suggested that members should be encouraged to send links to this page out to their friends and estate lawyers.
- **Insurance**: Our insurance company has sent us notice that Class 2 e-bikes are not covered by our insurance (while Class 1 and Class 3 are covered) so we must undertake to make sure that we screen out these e-bikes. They have provided us with the text of a document that we can ask event participants with e-bikes to sign to confirm that they have a Class 1 or Class 3 but not a Class 2 e-bike.
- **Clothing**: No new clothing sales this month. Leon reported receiving his NICA clothing order.
- Weekly Road Races: Joseph had to cancel two races this month due to smoke. In order to complete the season, he is extending the race schedule by one week but rescheduling the last two races over a single week. He is working on a survey of past racers to learn why participation levels didn't jump back to normal levels when inperson racing restarted.





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- NICA Team: The first race of the 2021 season, a time trial in North Tahoe, was cancelled due to smoke. The league built a new race course in Walker River State Recreation Area including 2 miles of single track built just this weekend in time for this weekend's race. There will be a Saturday pre-ride and a race on Sunday. There will be three more races in the series with one in Mammoth and two in Reno.
- Fall Century: No Report.
- Adopt A Highway: Thomas has indicated that he wishes to pass the role of adopt-a-highway coordinator to a new volunteer.
- **Pinenut Cracker**: Michael to work on the new map data upon returning from his upcoming trip. Carlo talked to Keith and Keith is very enthusiastic about supporting the restart of the Pinenut Cracker.
- King of Kingsbury Time Trial: Cancelled for 2021 due to smoke,ongoing fire and evacuations.
- **Challenge**: No update on accounting due to the fires as forest service staff are tied up. We'll discuss Admin expense next month.
- · Mixed Terrain: Four of our five course have now

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burned and time need for remediation is still unknown.

- Bike Advocacy: Fires have significantly impacted many or most of the regions most popular single track so trail work will dominate the agenda for TAMBA, NICA, etc. over the coming months.
- 2. Annual General Meeting & Fall Party: We paid the deposit for CVIC hall on for November 1. We'll decide on plans at the next board meeting.
- 3. Funding the Club in 2022: The board continued the conversation from last month. We need to continue to own our own event so we don't repeat the mistakes of the past however we should work with the Alpine County Chamber of Commerce on a Death Ride Training Series as we planned in 2020 with a limited number of participants. Nigel will set up a meeting with the Alpine County Chamber of October 11. Michael will look into a way of insuring against event cancellation risks. Carlo will pass along report on bicycle tourism.
- 4. Next Meeting: Monday, October 4, 2021, 6 pm, by Zoom call.

- 1. Monthly Status Reports:

  - · Membership: No report.
  - Weekend Rides: No report.
  - MTB Rides: The evenings are getting cooler and shorter but rides will continue for a few more weeks.
  - · Social Media: Gregg would like photos of the

- Newsletter: The newsletter needs to go out right away to notify members of the upcoming annual general meeting. Michael plans for it to go out on Thursday or Friday so everyone with content needs to get it in right away.
- Website: Jim reports that he will update the home page to replace the fall century notice with the annual general meeting notice and to remove race notices. The planned giving page is live and the NICA page link has replace the Junior Team link. Jim also mentioned that he won two gold medals for time trials in the NV senior games.



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- **Insurance**: Michael will work with Jim to get the e-bike declaration document on the website.
- **Clothing**: All clothing survived the evacuation. Nothing has been sold in the last month. Bruce noticed a reference to jerseys on the membership page that needs to be updated.
- Weekly Road Races: Joseph will work with Michael on getting gear back to shed. Joseph is still working to gather RFID chips. Final results for the season are posted on the website page. Joseph is working on a survey of past racers.
- Fall Century: Jennie reported that there was a good turn-out, the weather was great, and the day went well except for a delay in pizza preparation at the end of the ride. Michael noted that the Tim Rowe wrist bands that Hank passed out were a really great idea.
- Adopt A Highway: Only Bruce joined Thomas for the last clean-up. Thomas recruited Jordan Brooks to take over next year. The board voted to make Jordan Brooks the new Highway Cleanup Coordinator. [Nigel | Michael IUnanimous].
- **Pinenut Cracker**: Michael will connect with Brian to get things rolling again for the spring.
- Challenge: The board voted to pay \$1500 to Michael to cover his expenses. [Nigel | Bruce | Unanimous with Michael abstaining].
- NICA Team: Drew reported that the NICA team performed well at the recent Mammoth races with a third place finish as a team. Smoke was challenging with an AQI of over 130. Practices are being adjusted now to reflect the cooler temperatures and shorter days. The next races will be at Sierra Vista on the 17<sup>th</sup> and Hidden Valley on the 24<sup>th</sup>. Drew indicated that he is selecting a new vendor for NICA team clothing for next year.

- **Mixed Terrain**: Michael is anxious to be able to survey the courses post-fires to identify which course are still workable, which need to be rerouted or entirely replaced.
- **Bike Advocacy**: Carlo circulated a report on Alpine Country's opportunities for cycling tourism. He shared an update on the CVTA's Indian Hills trail and if permission comes through soon, trail work can start in the winter.
- Death Ride Training Series: A meeting has been scheduled with the ACCC for Wednesday October 13 by Zoom. Nigel, Carlo, Michael, and Frank will attend.
- 3. New Organizational Members: The board voted to make the Carson Valley Visitors Authority and Muscled Powered Organization Alta Alpina Members [Nigel | Michael | Unanimous].
- 4. Annual General Meeting: Michael circulated a proposal for an in-person annual general meeting at CVIC Hall in Minden with a simultaneous Zoom meeting. It was agreed by the board that the 2021 Annual Meeting will take place on November 1 at 6:30pm simultaneously by Zoom call and in-person at CVIC Hall. All participants must be members in good standing. The CVIC Hall attendance will be limited to the first 95 vaccinated members to RSVP. [Nigel | Bruce | Unanimous]. Jennie, Michael, and Bruce will work as a sub-committee to plan all of the details. Allan volunteered to help with setup on the evening of the event.
