

# Board Meeting Minutes—August 29, 2011

Secretary: Lauren Lindley; Other Board Members: Michael Bayer, Diane Bolton, Robert Braun, Pete Costa, Curtis Fong, Mel Maalouf, Joe Marzocco, Tim Rowe, Ellen Sherrill, Christine Zombro; Other Attendees: Jay Brandon, Marc Evans, Jim Slade, Christopher Rowe

#### 1. Monthly Status Reports:

- **Treasurer**: As of August 29th, our bank balance is currently \$53,849. Our paypal balance is \$50.
- **Membership**: 3 new members. Ride board gets dispersed to 160 emails.
- Weekend Rides: Next Hellacious is the week after Labor Day.
- Newsletter: Newsletter should go out shortly.
- Website: Board discussed move to a content management system. Mel asks the board to send Joe examples of sites they really like to give him examples of what he likes.
- Weekly Road Races: Road Race Series has ended for the season. 365 racers. Di asks to use the 55 racers that were either board members or previous season passes (\$440 loss) or had 52 instances of juniors (\$312 loss) to be included in the numbers for her budget.
- **Mountain Bike Races**: Ellen has still not met with Garrett. Board agreed via email to be a sponsor the IMBA Conference for \$1250, matched with \$1250 to equal \$2500 if the conference is brought to the basin.
- **Junior Team**: Finishing up for the year and will probably switch to mostly mountain biking for the fall season.
- Spring Century: No update.
- **Pinenut Cracker**: Robert Braun will remain on as race director for the next year and worst case scenario he might change the venue and use Indian Hills instead. The cost would be significantly less.
- Carson Valley Classic: No update.
- King of Kingsbury Time Trial: No update.
- **Cyclocross Race**: Kirkwood Cyclocross is Sept 17th. Date conflict with Reno Mountain Hillclimb and Folsom Cyclobration. Indian Hills Cyclocross will by Sunday, October 30th.
- **Bike Advocacy**: 3 Foot Law goes into effect October 1st in Nevada. Procrastinating Peddlers is hosting a ride on October 1st to promote the new law.

- Adopt A Highway: 6 particiants in a successful pickup organized by Casey.
- **Clothing**: We're sold out of most sizes. Pete agreed to take on a new clothing order .
- 2. End of the Year Dinner: 6:00 PM Monday, November 14th. Budget of \$1500. 80-100 people.
- 3. Ascent Douglas: Presentation from Jay Brandon and Jim Slade on Ascent Douglas and Douglas County's Economic Vitality Plan. The Ascent Douglas team is part of the outdoor recreation and lifestyle team. They are seeking to bring outdoor retailers and related business to the area. They attended Outdoor Retailer. They have an active social media campaign through their website, Facebook, Flicker, Twitter, etc. They also deal with local outreach programs and networking: they like to list and do articles about local companies who are outdoor retailers or manufacturers in the area as well as interface with local commercial outdoor activities or clubs like Alta Alpina. They would like us to feed them information on the club activities that would help illustrate what a vibrant outdoor recreational lifestyle the Douglas County community has.
- 4. Marc Evans Presentation: Rollers Class will be a T/Th Night class. There will be 16 slots available per week. Marc has also been doing a Tuesday Night Technique class on a crit-style course with 8-12 people/week. These will probably last until Sept/Oct. Marc proposes a Sweetwater Race from Gardnerville to Sweetwater. The club urges him to become the race director to see it realized. Marc is interested in having Alta Alpina provide him a stipend for his weekly race technique clinics (currently free to Alta Alpina Members). Board agreed to include Marc's flyer in the next newsletter.
- 5. Alta Alpina Challenge: The surveys for riders regarding date choices have gone out. The preference thus far is to stick with the June day. Michael is still putting together next year's budget. Key priorities: move the website to a new platform and to pick a date. BBQ went well.
- 6. **Next Meeting:** Monday, October 3, 2011, 6 pm, Pizza Factory in Gardnerville.



## Board Meeting Minutes-October 10, 2011

#### 1. Monthly Status Reports:

- **Treasurer**: The current balance is \$13,482.89, we've opened a \$40K CD (7 Mon) which is effectively self-insurance for future activities, the Paypal account has aboute \$50.
- **Membership**: Membership fees will probably not change in 2012 remaining at the incredibly low rates of \$25 for individuals, \$40 for families. These fees reflect the expectation that all members will volunteer for our fund raising events. Once again non members who attend the annual dinner will be charged for a 2011 membership or upgrade to family membership.
- Weekend Rides: It was proposed that the rideboard should send a copy of the non-member waiver to ride leaders just before their rides so we're covered by insurance.
   Board discussed the idea of having joint rides with other club ssuch as East Sierra Velo in Bridgeport and Procrastinating Peddlers.
- **Newsletter**: Should go out in the next couple of days. Will announce annual meeting date.
- Website: Needs to be updated with Annual Meeting Information. Joe is working on a plan to move website to a new content management system and is looking for a design.
- Weekly Road Races: Race season has wrapped up, Di has passed on expenses/income data to Pete.
- Mountain Bike Races: No Update.
- **Spring Century**: Tentatively Memorial Day Weekend.
- Pinenut Cracker: Scheduled for May 19, 2012.
- Wild Hillacious: Series concluded. Finishers should visit the website and confirm that their

stats are correct. If anything needs to be updated, contact Twain. Twain arranged with Alpine County Chamber of Commerce to include Death Ride in the series.

- **Carson Valley Classic**: Curtis proposed rebuilding CVC as a hosted stage race for invited teams rather than individuals masters race.
- King of Kingsbury Time Trial: Need to check with Allan on plan for next year.
- **Cyclocross Race**: Oct 30, Indian Hills. Need volunteers at 7:30am to set up course, marshals, registration, and results.
- **Bike Advocacy**: 3' rule has gone into effect as of Oct 1.
- Adopt A Highway: No report.
- **Clothing**: Curtis will get clothing quote from Pace. Pete will coordinate new clothing order.
- 2. Alta Alpina Challenge: Survey results from this years riders are split between June 9 and June 30 dates. Non-rider surveys preferred a later date. June 30 makes ambulance service easier and improves likelihood of better weather. Curtis urged the board not to move the date around every year. Last Saturday in 2013 is available too so board decided to commit to last Saturday in June for both 2012 and 2013. In 2014 we'll either return to 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday or continue with the last Saturday. Board approves a \$2000 marketing budget for Laura to begin the marketing campaign. Michael will contact John Cotter, Twain, and others to get the date posted and secured.
- 3. **Membership Server Upgrade:** Michael requested \$128.98 for software upgrade .
- 4. **Next Meeting:** Monday, November 14, 2011, after the annual meeting in South Lake Tahoe.
