A new variation on an annual Pinenuts classic. This time we'll start at Dorea's Ranch (see rideboard for address), she'll lead us around some favorite trails, then we'll finish at the ranch for a grill. Bring something to grill, something to share (e.g. bread, salad, cookies), something to drink, something to sit on! This is a series of mtn bike rides, every Tuesday evening after work. We go all summer long doing different rides each week, barely repeating any all season. Most are out-and-back format, so don't be stressed about fitness, we want riders of all levels. We'll usually grab some refreshments afterwards, either trailhead tailgate, or at a local establishment. Come and join in!

The "HAM CRAM" day takes place at the fire station in Zephyr Cove from 9:30am to 4:30pm. Participants will review exam guestions from 9:30 to 2:00, take the test from 3:00 to 4:30pm, and then get their license if they pass.

Our annual May member event, now a Cyclorama, will be taking place on May 17th! If you haven't already done so, please renew your club membership so that you can participate.



Meeting held by Zoom

Meeting called to order at 6:03 pm

Minutes of the March meeting approved as presented. [Bruce | Michael | Unanimous]

1. Monthly Status Reports:

- Treasurer: The current checking account balance is \$9,008.40. The Paypal balance is \$1,941.50. The CDs are at \$12,025.19, \$12,037.93, and \$10,939.31.
- Membership: Membership renewals are coming in at a brisk pace in the lead up to the Spring Party Allen reported that he couldn't access the database today and Michael said he would resolve the issue tonight.
- Weekend Rides: Lyn has ride leaders lined up for Spring Rider Roundup this weekend. Lyn has also scheduled a 2025 ride leaders meeting for April 23 at ShoeTree in Minden at 6pm. Everyone interested in leading rides in 2025 should attend. Lyn will buy everyone who signs up to lead a free beer.
- Weekly MTB Rides: Nigel reported that he has started the ride series early this year due to favorable weather. Attendance has been good at the rides so far this year.
- Social Media: Michelle has been promoting the Spring Party and the Spring Rider Roundup. Michelle reported that the Death Ride team have been really great about promoting Alta Alpina posts.
- Newsletter: Michael plans to publish the next newsletter on Wednesday or Thursday of next week in order to include news from the Spring Party and the Rider Roundup.
- Insurance: Michael moved that the board approve a \$939.63 expenditure for the purchase of the 2025 race insurance policy [Michael I Allen I Unanimous].
- Clothing: Bruce will bring inventory to the Spring Party and set up the clothing table.

- Weekly Road Races: Posters are up and going up at local bike stores. There was a consensus to proceed with the plan to offer free race passes for first time racers. Joseph will have coupons printed and distributed to the same stores with posters. Joseph is ready for the 2025 season but still looking for an assistant. New chip brackets for both standard and aero forks are designed and Jordan volunteered to help with the 3D printing. Joseph also floated the idea of converting one of the Blue Lakes time trials to a road race.
- NICA Team: Timari met with the new NICA league director. New for the 2025 season.
 Categories will switch from grade-based to ability-based. The pre-season starts a month earlier which will allow more recruiting from the middle schools and high schools. Timari is looking for help with connections in the school district. Michelle has connections and Timari will work with Lori to develop flyers.
- Cyclorama: More volunteers are needed for May 17 the start and finish, etc. Final details will be in the next newsletter.
- Adopt A Highway: Highway cleanup dates will be posted to the rideboard soon.
- **Death Ride Training Series**: There are 20 people registered.
- Spring Party: It was agreed that the shopping list should be the same as last year. Michael will send out setup details to board members available to help with setup.
- 3. **Voler Clothing:** Michael and Timari are exploring options for returning to Voler.
- 4. **Challenge Permit Fee:** USFS is requiring a payment of \$98.77 to maintain our 5 year permit. [Michael I Frank I Unanimous].
- Next Meeting: Monday, May 5, 2025, 5:30pm, Swim Center in Gardnerville. Timari will look into a source of Mexican food.
